## Mission Board Helping Hands Christmas Project

This year instead of buying items for individual TIGER Pack kids, what they have requested, and have a critical need for, is funding for individual circumstances that arise. For example, they notice a child with no boots. They would be able to go to a fund we have collected and have the money available there to buy this child boots. They will report to our Board every time they used money from this fund, the amount and purpose. If a child needs help with funding for a field trip, same scenario...they will go to the fund and then report to us what they used the money for and what amount was used. Accountability on their part, and helping us keep track of the level of the fund for our part.

We know it's fun to go buy a child a new winter coat, pj's, boots, etc. But this year, we are asking folks to just place that same \$10, \$15, \$25 or more

they would have spent on clothing in the little envelope from the tree. Last year, we exceeded our \$800 goal so this year we have set the goal at \$1,000!

The process is simple:

1. Pick a card or cards in the \$10, \$15 and \$25 amounts.
2. Place your contribution in the card provided (check or cash).
3. Put gift in the offering plate any Sunday December.



## Poinsettias for the Advent & Christmas Seasons



We will be decorating the sanctuary with poinsettias for the Advent and Christmas seasons. We welcome poinsettias of any color and size.

The church has purchased 30 poinsettias from the Tiger Pack fundraiser and these are available for sponsorship. The cost of the Tiger Pack poinsettias is \$10.00 per plant and the proceeds benefit their many programs. If you are interested in purchasing one of these poinsettias, we will have them for sale following worship on December

6<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>. You may choose either pink, white, or Monet and we will place a sticker on the bottom so you can identify it after Christmas and take it home, if you choose.

Poinsettias may also be purchased from a florist of your choice. Pink and white are our preferred colors. If you purchase them somewhere else and have them delivered, please make sure the card clearly indicates who the plant is being given by and who it is in memory or celebration of.

If you bring your own poinsettia to the church and it is sponsored in memory of a loved one or in honor of a special occasion, please make sure that information is conveyed to the church office. To be noted in the Christmas Eve bulletin, please have your poinsettia to the church by the Sunday, December 18<sup>th</sup>.

It is not true that our hopes for liberation of humankind, of justice, of human dignity of peace are not meant for this earth and for this history –

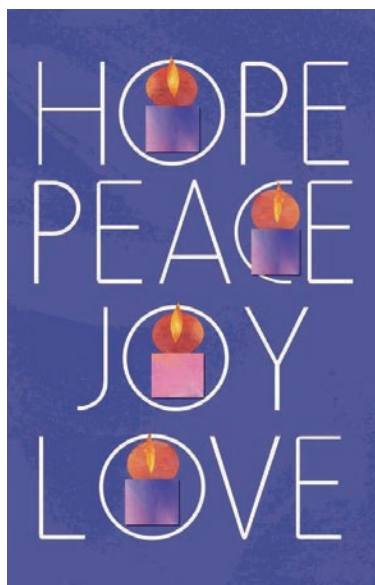
This is true: The hour comes, and it is now, that the true worshipers shall worship God in spirit and in truth.
