For my sixteen years of ministry it has been the norm but it continues to engender an untold amount of anxiety for me as a pastor. As I talk with my colleagues it is the same for them. There are never enough hours in the day to finish everything we would like to get done. Even when we have put in a 60-70 work week (yes, it really happens!) we still feel guilty turning out the office lights and going home when we know there is still something that could use our attention.

Thankfully, I like being busy. I also like being “finished” every once in a while. Unfortunately, that doesn’t seem to happen very often in my world. One of my greatest fears in life is that when all is said and done, I will discover that I somehow didn’t do enough. Does anyone else ever experience that fear? It’s not that I expect to die with lots of regrets, but simply with the notion that there is something more I could and should have done. It’s a very real fear but guess what...

The Good News of our faith is that Good Friday and Easter have already happened. It truly is finished. Forgiveness and salvation and the hope for eternal life have already been realized and are ours for the taking! Yes, indeed, “It is finished.” And this is amazingly good news for you and for me, today and forever.
